SPRING 2019 Recipient:

Hi, my name is Gail McCabe. I have always considered myself extremely blessed, as I have a great husband, two beautiful children, a large and loving extended family, a job I love, and a very strong faith. I had my first mammogram at 40, as this is the current recommended age (PLEASE, PLEASE take note of this girls). I was not worried because I considered myself to be fairly low risk, as I was young, healthy, and did not have a strong family history of breast cancer. A few days after the mammogram, I was called back in for an ultrasound, as they noticed several "areas of concern." I still was not worried, as they indicated that this was not abnormal, especially since it was my first mammogram and they did not have a baseline. After the ultrasound, I was informed by the radiologist that they wanted to biopsy one of the areas of concern. I received the results of that biopsy on September 21st of this past year. That phone call would forever alter the course of my life, as well as the life of my family. I was informed that I had invasive ductal carcinoma...I was part of the 1 in 8 women who will develop invasive breast cancer over the course of their lifetime. Since my diagnosis, I have had both good days and bad days...the bad days are filled with the uncertainty that come with this diagnosis. I am humbled and absolutely honored that you have chosen me to be part of this awesome event! I thank each and every one of you from the very bottom of my heart.

FALL 2019 Recipient:

Tabby got sick at the age of 3 and at 3 1/2 was diagnosed with Pilocytic astrocytoma, a type of brain tumor/cancer. She has endured permanent hearing loss in her left ear due to the tumor. The first type of treatment was surgery to remove the tumor. They were able to remove 95% of the tumor with the remaining too close to the brain stem. Although she was on Chemo, the tumor started to grow back and she had to have a second surgery. Her last MRI showed that it is somewhat stable. She is currently continuing her Chemo treatments. She lives in Kaukauna with her parents, Nicole and Andy and her brother, Ian.
